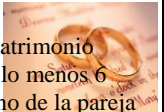

Dear Parishioners,
 “Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing” (Lk 10:41-42).
 We can become slaves to what we do, getting all ‘hot and bothered’. Jesus invites us to focus on the only thing that matters: living his word as we live for him. This makes our work a creative act of love.

There is much affection in repeating this name: “Martha, Martha”! The house in Bethany, near Jerusalem, was a place Jesus would stop and rest with his disciples. In the city, he was drawn into debates; he found antagonism and rejection. In Bethany, instead, he felt welcome and found peace.

Martha was enterprising and active. She showed it later when her brother died and she engaged Jesus in a lengthy conversation, questioning him energetically. She was a strong woman who showed great faith. When “Jesus said to her, ‘I am the resurrection and the life... Do you believe this?’ She said to him, ‘Yes, Lord, I believe’” (Jn 11:25-27). She answered without any hesitation.

At this point she was extremely busy, organizing a special welcome for the master and his disciples. She was the mistress of the house (as her name suggests: Martha means “mistress”), and so she felt responsible. She was probably preparing the evening meal for her important guest. Her sister Mary had left her all alone to do the work. Contrary to the traditions of the East, Mary did not go to the kitchen but remained with the men to listen to Jesus, sitting at his feet, just like the perfect disciple. This gave rise to the rather resentful comment by Martha: “Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me” (Lk 10:40).

And Jesus’ affectionate, yet firm reply was: “Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing.”

Was Jesus not happy with the enterprising and generous service of Martha? Didn’t he appreciate her concrete and practical way of welcoming him, and wouldn’t he be happy to eat the food that was being prepared? Shortly after this episode, in his parables he will praise the administrators, businesspeople and employees who know how to use their talents creatively and do business with their goods (see Lk 12:42; 19:12-26). He even praises shrewdness (see Lk 16:1-8). He could not but rejoice at seeing a woman so full of initiative and capable of giving a warm and abundant welcome.

What Jesus calls attention to is the state she was in, how bothered and worried she was about her work. Martha is agitated, “distracted by her many tasks” (Lk 10:40); she has lost her calm. It is no longer she who controls her work, but it is her work that has taken control and tyrannizes her. She is no longer free; she has become a slave to what she does.

Doesn’t it happen also to us at times that we get lost in the thousands of things to do? We are drawn to and distracted by the internet, by messaging, by useless posts. Even when we have serious commitments to occupy us, they can make us forget to be attentive to others, to listen to people right next to us. Above all, the danger is that we lose sight of why and who we are working for. Our work and other concerns become ends in themselves.

Or else we are overcome by anxiety and agitation when we face difficult situations and problems with our family, money matters, career, school and the future of our children—to such an extent that we forget the words of Jesus: “Therefore do not worry, saying, ‘What will we eat?’ or ‘What will we drink?’ or ‘What will we wear?’ For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things” (Mt 6:31-32). We too deserve Jesus’ criticism: “Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing.”

What is the only thing needed? To hear and live the words of Jesus. Before these words and before he who speaks them, we cannot put anything at all. The true way of welcoming the Lord, of making him feel at home, is to welcome what he says. This is what Mary did: forgetting everything else, she put herself at his feet and did not miss a single word.

If we do that we will be guided not by our desire to be noticed or to have the first place, but only by pleasing him, by being at the service of his kingdom.

Like Martha, we too are called to do “many things” for the good of others. Jesus has taught us that the Father is happy when we bear “much fruit” (see John 15:8) and that we will even do greater things than he did (see Jn 14:12). He looks therefore at our dedication, our passion in doing the work he has given us to do, our imagination, courage and resourcefulness. He wants us to do many things without getting bothered and agitated, but keeping the peace that comes from knowing we are doing God’s will.

The only thing that matters therefore is to become Jesus’ disciples, letting him live in us, being attentive to what he suggests with his gentle voice that prompts us moment by moment. In this way he will be the one who guides us in every act. In doing “many things” we will not be distracted and side-tracked, because by following Jesus’ words we will be moved by love alone. In all we do, we will always do only one thing: love.

“Martha, Martha, tú estás preocupada y molesta por tantas cosas; pero una sola cosa es necesaria” (Lc 10, 41-42).

¿Cuánto afecto al repetir este nombre: Marta, Marta! La casa de Betania, a las puertas de Jerusalén, es un lugar donde Jesús suele detenerse y descansar con sus discípulos. Fuera, en la ciudad, debe discutir, encuentra oposición y rechazo; en cambio aquí hay paz y acogida.

Marta es emprendedora y activa. Lo demostrará también en la muerte de su hermano, cuando entabla con Jesús una conversación firme, en la cual lo interpela con energía. Es una mujer fuerte, que muestra una gran fe. A la pregunta: «¿Crees que yo soy la resurrección y la vida?», responde sin dudarle: «Sí, Señor, creo» (cf. Jn 11, 25-27).

También ahora está atareada preparando una acogida digna para el Maestro y sus discípulos. Es la anfitriona (lo dice su propio nombre: Marta significa «dueña») y por eso se siente responsable. Probablemente está preparando la cena para este huésped de categoría. María, su hermana, la ha dejado sola en la tarea. En lugar de quedarse en la cocina según las costumbres orientales, se une a los hombres para escuchar a Jesús, sentada a sus pies, como haría una discípula perfecta. De ahí la intervención un poco resentida de Marta: «Señor, ¿no te importa que mi hermana me haya dejado sola para servir? Dile que me eche una mano» (Lc 10, 40). Y esta es la respuesta afectuosa y a la vez firme de Jesús: “Marta, Marta, tú estás preocupada y molesta por tantas cosas; pero una sola cosa es necesaria.”

¿Es que no le gustaba a Jesús el estilo emprendedor y el servicio generoso de Marta? ¿Acaso no agradecía su acogida concreta y no iba a tomar con gusto las viandas que le estaba preparando? Poco después de este episodio, en otras parábolas, alabaré a administradores, emprendedores y empleados que saben sacar provecho de sus talentos y negociar con los bienes (cf. Lc 12, 42; 19, 12-26). Incluso alaba su astucia (cf. Lc 16, 1-8), de modo que no podía alegrarse de ver a una mujer tan llena de iniciativa y capaz de una acogida diligente y generosa.

Lo que le reprocha es el afán y la preocupación que pone en su trabajo. Está agitada, «afanada con los muchos servicios» (Lc 10, 40), ha perdido la calma. Ya no es ella la que dirige el trabajo, sino el trabajo el que ha tomado la delantera y la tiraniza. Ya no es libre, se ha vuelto esclava de sus tareas.

¿No nos sucede también a nosotros a veces que nos dispersamos en las mil cosas que hay que hacer? Nos dejamos atraer y distraer por Internet, los chats, los superfluos mensajes del móvil. Incluso aunque nos ocupemos en trabajos serios, estos pueden hacer que nos olvidemos de prestar atención a los demás, de escuchar a las personas que tenemos cerca. El peligro está sobre todo en perder de vista por qué y para quién trabajamos. El trabajo y las demás ocupaciones se convierten en fin en sí mismos.

O quizá nos pueden el ansia y la agitación ante situaciones y problemas difíciles que atañen a la familia, la economía, la profesión, las clases, nuestro futuro o el de nuestros hijos, hasta hacernos olvidar las palabras de Jesús: «No andéis agobiados pensando en qué vais a comer, o qué vais a beber, o con qué os vais a vestir. Los paganos se afanan por esas cosas. Ya sabe vuestro Padre celestial que tenéis necesidad de todo eso» (Mt 6, 31-32). También nosotros merecemos la reprimenda de Jesús: “Marta, Marta, tú estás preocupada y molesta por tantas cosas; pero una sola cosa es necesaria.”

¿Qué es lo único necesario? Escuchar y vivir las palabras de Jesús. A ellas —y a Él, que habla— no se les puede anteponer absolutamente nada. El verdadero modo de hospedar a Jesús, de acogerlo, es acoger lo que Él nos dice. Tal como hizo María, que se olvidó de todo, se puso a sus pies y no se perdió ni una palabra suya. Así no nos moverá el deseo de figurar ni de sobresalir, sino de darle gusto a Él, de estar al servicio de su reino.

Como Marta, también nosotros estamos llamados a hacer «muchas cosas» por el bien de los demás. Jesús nos ha enseñado que el Padre quiere que demos «mucho fruto» (cf. Jn 15, 8) y que haremos incluso cosas mayores que Él (cf. Jn 14, 12). Es decir, Él espera de nosotros dedicación, pasión en el trabajo que se nos encomienda, inventiva, audacia e iniciativa. Pero sin afán ni agitación, con la paz que viene de saber que estamos cumpliendo la voluntad de Dios.

Lo único que importa es, pues, convertirse en discípulos de Jesús, dejar que Él viva en nosotros, estar atentos a sus sugerencias, a su voz sutil, que nos orienta en cada momento. De este modo será Él quien nos guíe en cualquier acción nuestra.

Cuando hagamos «muchas cosas», no estaremos distraídos ni dispersos porque, siguiendo las palabras de Jesús, nos moverá solo el amor. En cualquier ocupación haremos siempre una sola cosa: amar.
