From Our Pastor



"If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet" (John 13:14).

It's usually the disciples who sit and learn at the Master's feet, but at the Last Supper, Jesus, the only real Lord and Master, took off his outer garment, poured water into a basin and began washing his disciples' feet. Peter objected, "Lord, do you wash my feet?" But the Teacher convinced him; this is the only way Peter can 'have part' with him. It was a sort of baptism.

Then he said to his disciples: "I have given you an example, so that you can do as I have done... Now that you have learned these things, *"blessed are you if you do them."*

"Blessed are you!" Mutual love as taught by Jesus with this surprising gesture of washing his disciples' feet is a beatitude. When we Christians think of the beatitudes, we usually remember the ones from the Gospels of Matthew and Luke: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of Heaven. Blessed are those who mourn. Blessed are those who hunger." The word used in the Gospels for "beatitude" means sharing in the life of God. It's more than mere happiness. It's the experience of sharing in God's very life.

In John's Gospel, Jesus proclaims two more beatitudes: the beatitude of those who believe in Jesus without seeing him (John 20:29), and the beatitude experienced by those who love one another (John 13:17).

By washing his disciples' feet, Jesus, the Lord and Master gave a clear and practical illustration of his new commandment that we love one another. The service Jesus performed was usually carried out by slaves who washed the feet of their owners or other free citizens. Jesus shows us that humility is the foundation of love. In washing his disciples' feet, the Lord shows us what our God is like: God is Love. This Lord and Master clearly shows that he comes not to be served, but to serve. For Jesus, this was no isolated act of humility. It represented all his behavior, his love that reaches to the point of self-emptying on the cross, all out of love for us.

Jesus invites us to follow his example and adopt the new commandment as our way of life; otherwise, our Christian life doesn't really make sense. But if we manage to do what Jesus asks, we'll reach the very heart of the Gospel and be truly "blessed".

De Parte de Nuestro Pastor



"Si yo, el Señor y el maestro, he lavado vuestros pies, vosotros también debéis lavar los pies unos a otros" (John 13:14).

Son por lo general los discípulos que se sientan y aprenden en los pies del Maestro, pero en la Última Cena, Jesús, el único verdadero Señor y Maestro, quitó su ropa exterior, vertió el agua en un lavado y comenzó a lavar los pies de sus discípulos. Pedro se opuso, "¿Señor, lavas mis pies?" Pero el Maestro lo convenció; esto es el único modo que Pedro puede "tener parte" con él. Era una especie de bautismo.

Entonces él dijo a sus discípulos: "os he dado ejemplo, para que ustedes puedan hacer como lo he hecho... Ahora que han aprendido estas cosas,

"benditos son ustedes si lo hacen".

"¡Bendito eres!" El amor mutuo como enseñado por Jesús con este sorprendente gesto de lavar los pies a sus discípulos es una bienaventuranza. Cuando los cristianos piensan de las Bienaventuranzas, normalmente recordamos los de los Evangelios de Mateo y Lucas: "Benditos los pobres en espíritu, porque de ellos es el Reino de los cielos. Benditos los que lloran. Benditos los que tienen hambre". La palabra usada en los Evangelios de "bienaventuranza" significa compartir la vida de Dios. Es más que la mera felicidad. Es la experiencia de compartir en la vida misma de Dios.

En el Evangelio de Juan, Jesús proclama dos más bienaventuranzas: la bienaventuranza de los que creen en Jesús sin verlo (Juan 20:29), y la bienaventuranza experimentada por aquellos que se aman unos a otros (Juan 13:17).

Lavando los pies de sus discípulos, Jesús, el Señor y Maestro dio una ilustración clara y práctica de su nuevo mandamiento que amamos el uno al otro. El servicio que Jesús realizó era por lo general realizado por esclavos que lavaron los pies de sus dueños u otros ciudadanos libres. Jesús nos muestra que la humildad es la fundación de amor. En el lavado de los pies de sus discípulos, el Señor nos muestra a qué nuestro Dios parece: Dios es Amor. Este Señor y Maestro claramente muestra que viene para no ser servido, pero para servir. Para Jesús, esto no era ningún acto aislado de la humildad. Representó todo su comportamiento, su amor que alcanza al punto de auto vaciamiento en la cruz, todo por amor a nosotros.

Jesús nos invita a seguir su ejemplo y adoptar el nuevo mandamiento como nuestra forma de vida; de lo contrario, nuestra vida cristiana no tiene realmente sentido. Pero si conseguimos hacer lo que Jesús nos pide, vamos a llegar al corazón del Evangelio y ser verdaderamente "bendecidos."
