From Our Pastor



Luke's Gospel reports that Jesus appeared to two of his disciples who were walking from Jerusalem to Emmaus after his resurrection. They were feeling appalled by all the terrible and discouraging events that they had just witnessed in Jerusalem, where Jesus had been arrested, tortured and crucified. As they walked together, the stranger helped them to understand the meaning of all that suffering. It was all part of God's loving plan to save us. This must have rekindled some hope in their hearts, because, when they reached Emmaus, they urged the stranger to join them for supper: "Stay with us, because it's almost evening" (Lk 24:29). When he was at table with them, he blessed the bread and shared it with them. As he did, they recognized him. It was Jesus who had been crucified, and was now risen! They immediately changed their plans and went back to Jerusalem to find the other disciples and tell them the good news.

We too can be disappointed, appalled and discouraged by a terrible sense of powerlessness in the face of injustices done to defenseless innocent people. Our own lives too are not without suffering, uncertainty and darkness. We would like it all to be transform into peace, hope and light for ourselves and others. Do we want to meet Someone who can profoundly understand us and cast light on our journey through life?

Jesus freely accepted the experience of suffering that we experience, so that he could be with us in the depths of our pain. He experienced physical suffering, but also spiritual suffering: from being deserted by his friends to feeling abandoned by God whom he had always called his Father. But his unshakeable faith in God's love enabled him to overcome this infinite suffering, and with a heroic act of love, he entrusted himself once more to that Father.

He has drawn all of us onto that same path and would like to accompany us on our way. He's there in everything that has to do with suffering. Let's try to recognize him in all our problems, in all the darkness, in our own personal tragedies and those of our neighbors and in the sufferings of people around us. These sufferings are His, because He has made them His own.

As we continue to celebrate the death and resurrection of Jesus, let's rekindle our faith in God's love that will enable us to transform suffering into love. Every loss, separation, failure – even death itself – can become a source of light and peace if we embrace Jesus Forsaken. Certain of Jesus's closeness to us in every suffering, let's continue to say the prayer of the disciples of Emmaus: "Stay with us, because it is almost evening!"

De Parte de Nuestro Pastor



El Evangelio de Lucas relata que Jesús se apareció a dos de sus discípulos que estaban caminando de Jerusalén a Emaús después de su resurrección. Se sentían desconcertados por todos los acontecimientos terribles y desalentadores que acababan de presenciar en Jerusalén, donde Jesús había sido arrestado, torturado y crucificado.

A lo largo del camino, el desconocido los ayuda a captar el significado de aquellos acontecimientos a partir de la Escritura y enciende de nuevo la esperanza en sus corazones. Al llegar a Emaús, lo retienen para cenar: «Quédate con nosotros, porque atardece». Mientras están a la mesa juntos, el desconocido bendice el pan y lo comparte con ellos. Un gesto que permite reconocerlo: ¡el Crucificado estaba muerto y ahora ha resucitado! E inmediatamente los dos cambian de planes: vuelven a Jerusalén a buscar a los demás discípulos y darles la gran noticia.

También nosotros podemos sentirnos desilusionados, indignados, desanimados por una sensación trágica de impotencia ante las injusticias que golpean a personas inocentes e inermes. En nuestra vida no faltan el dolor, la incertidumbre, la oscuridad... ¡Y cómo nos gustaría transformarlos en paz, esperanza y luz para nosotros y para los demás!

¿Queremos encontrar a Alguien que nos entienda hasta el fondo y nos ilumine el camino de la vida? Jesús, el Hombre-Dios, para estar seguro de llegar a cada uno de nosotros en lo profundo de su situación, aceptó libremente pasar, como nosotros, por el túnel del dolor. Del dolor físico, pero también del interior, desde la traición de sus amigos hasta sentirse abandonado por ese Dios al que siempre había llamado Padre. Gracias a esa confianza inquebrantable en el amor de Dios, superó ese inmenso dolor y se volvió a entregar a Él. Y de Él recibió nueva vida.

También a nosotros nos ha llevado por este mismo camino y quiere acompañarnos: «...Él está presente en todo lo que sabe a dolor... Procuremos reconocer a Jesús en todas las angustias y penurias de la vida, en cualquier oscuridad, en las tragedias personales y de los demás, en los sufrimientos de la humanidad que nos rodea. Son Él porque Él las ha hecho suyas... Bastará con hacer algo concreto por aliviar sus sufrimientos en los pobres... para encontrar una nueva plenitud de vida».

Esta semana es una ocasión para avivar nuestra fe en el amor de Dios, que nos permite transformar el dolor en amor; cualquier desgarrro, separación, fracaso y hasta la muerte, pueden convertirse también para nosotros en fuente de luz y de paz. Seguros de la cercanía de Dios a cada uno de *nosotros en cualquier situación, repitamos con confianza la oración de los discípulos de Emaús: «Quédate con nosotros, porque atardece».*

them to share how they lived one of the points of the Cube of Love. We request that the flowers be brought from your own gardens, and not picked from the Church yard.

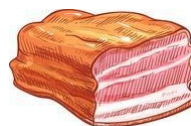

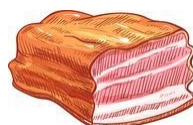
